



Kingsville GED Program

Kingsville LULAC Manor

Since 2021, 20 Kingsville LULAC Manor (KLM) adult learners have taken charge of their futures through a free, on-site High School Equivalency Program. Thanks to a continued partnership between Prospera and the Brush Country Literacy Council (BCLC), residents are receiving the support they need to achieve their educational goals. Led by instructor Christopher Aguiree-Hamilton, 14 residents have graduated with their GEDs over the years, with several more on track to follow. For many students, earning a GED is more than just passing an exam—it's a transformative achievement that brings confidence, opportunity, and a deep sense of pride.

Programs like this are essential to many adult learners facing systemic barriers to education, including financial constraints, lack of transportation, or negative past experiences with school. By providing high-quality, no-cost instruction directly in the community, BCLC and Prospera are helping close those gaps and create lasting change.

This initiative reflects Prospera's broader mission to provide affordable housing with supportive services that uplift and empower residents. Education is one of the most important tools for transformation. By bringing learning opportunities into their communities, residents not only improve their own lives, but they also strengthen the futures of their families and neighborhoods.

Through consistency, compassion, and collaboration, the GED program at KLM is opening doors. With every diploma earned, residents are reminded that it's never too late to learn, grow, and achieve something great.

Meet Elder Curtis Lindesay

Bavarian Manor Apartments

For the past eight years, **Bavarian Manor Apartments (BMA)** and Fountain of Life Community Church (FOLCC) Elder, Curtis Lindesay, have cultivated a meaningful collaboration dedicated to serving the community in a steadfast partnership. Their enduring joint efforts have enriched the lives of residents through initiatives that provide essential resources, encouragement, and a sense of belonging.

Together, they have helped sustain BMA's Angel Food Pantry, ensuring families can access nutritious meals. Their commitment extends to maintaining a well-stocked clothing closet and offering professional attire to those seeking employment. Understanding the importance of education, they equipped children for success last August by supplying backpacks and school supplies to 60 youth. Beyond academics, they have also nurtured a love for learning through youth reading programs and supported women in the community with dedicated empowerment groups designed to inspire and uplift.

A cherished highlight of this partnership is the annual holiday celebration, when BMA and Elder Lindesay come together to bring warmth and festive cheer to the residents. FOLCC continued the tradition in 2024 by serving over 100 meals and delivering gifts and stockings to 64 children, ensuring every family experienced the joy of the season.

Elder Lindesay and FOLCC have made a lasting impact on the BMA community. They exemplify the power of unity, generosity, and a shared commitment to uplifting those in need. Their continued partnership is a testament to the profound difference that collective compassion can make.





Meet Grandma Gucci

Oak Manor Apartments

Shirley Bates is not your average affordable housing resident. At **Oak Manor Apartments (OMA)**, she is known as Grandma Gucci. Ms. Bates delights in mentoring the community youth. Last November, for her birthday, rather than celebrating in the traditional way, Ms. Bates chose to seek donations from her friends, family, and church to throw the ultimate birthday bash for the OMA resident youth. She collected and distributed 125 bikes, 111 scooters, 12 electric carts, and seven tricycles. She also hosted a party where the older resident youth helped serve the younger youth pizza and treats. Additionally, Ms. Bates's long-term friend brought his limousine for the kids to get in and experience. She proudly stated, "Most of these young people had never seen a limousine before, let alone be able to get in and explore."

Ms. Bates has called the **Oak Manor Apartment** community home for nine years and confidently says, "It has been the best nine years of my life." Ms. Bates lives by her strong moral and religious convictions and teaches the youth to be respectful and kind to one another. Oak Manor Apartment's youth know when they are hungry, they can always knock on her door for pizza, Lunchables, or a piece of fruit. She does not believe anyone should go hungry and keeps these staples on hand. Youth, in turn, give back to Ms. Bates. When she was sick, she had several youth knocking on her door, offering to take out her trash and other small acts of kindness. Ms. Bates fosters a sense of community at **Oak Manor Apartments**. Thriving communities look out for each other and help where they can. Ms. Bates said, "It was a birthday I will never forget."



Meet Shiloh

Vista Verde Apartments

“I love my apartment. It’s the first apartment I’ve had on my own, so it’s a big adjustment. There aren’t enough words to describe how it feels. I went from having everything I owned fit into a hall closet to a beautiful space to call my own. It still doesn’t seem quite real and can make me cry when I think about it.”

Shiloh grew up surrounded by constant change. Originally from Minneapolis, her family moved frequently, often switching schools and neighborhoods every few months. As a young adult, she relocated to Wisconsin and later became a Navy wife, traveling to places like Vermont, Florida, and New Jersey. After years of moving and facing health challenges, including a stroke that affected her mobility and energy, Shiloh realized she needed more support. She decided to move to San Antonio to be closer to her daughter.

Residing with her daughter in a shared housing arrangement proved less than ideal. This led to sleeping on a friend’s couch while she figured out her next steps.

As a member of Molina Healthcare, one of Prospera’s Managed Care Organization (MCO) partners, Shiloh shared her housing struggles with her Service Coordinator. She was referred to Prospera’s Housing Navigation program, where she completed an intake and received referrals to properties that matched her needs and budget, one of which was Prospera’s **Vista Verde Apartments (VVA)**.

Shiloh didn’t have transportation, but Prospera was able to secure transportation, allowing her to tour VVA and join the waitlist. As time passed, her situation grew more complex. Finally, the call came from VVA that an apartment was available!

Today, Shiloh and her family participate in the on-site community events such as Healthy Living sessions, Egg Hunts, Potlucks, National Night Out, Holiday Events, and Food Bank Distributions. To Shiloh, VVA isn’t just a place to live—it’s a fresh start, a peaceful space to heal, and the home she’s always dreamed of.



Meet Free

Fox Run Apartments

Growing up, Free faced significant challenges due to her mother's struggles with mental illness, which led to an unstable home environment. Without a secure foundation, it was difficult for Free to focus on her education or plan for her future. When the situation became overwhelming, her grandmother offered her a stable home at **Fox Run Apartments** in Victoria, Texas, a Prospera Community.

With a safe and secure place to live, Free could turn her attention to her goals. No longer worried about where she would sleep or whether she would have the support she needed, she began excelling academically. The Services Manager at Fox Run Apartments played a crucial role in her journey, inviting her to attend the 2024 Higher Education Exploration Event. Free saw it as an opportunity to take the next step toward her dream. The event introduced her to various college and career pathways, reinforcing her passion for medicine and highlighting the resources available to make her aspirations a reality.

Free graduated from high school on the Honor Roll and is now a student at Victoria College, taking courses to prepare for a future in the medical field. Her dedication and perseverance have not gone unnoticed. She earned a spot on the Dean's List of Honor Students, reflecting her hard work and determination. She credits her success to having a stable home, knowing that without it, she wouldn't have been able to focus on school or her plans. Looking ahead, she plans to utilize her education and experiences to make a positive impact on the lives of others.
